Comprised of 52 member firms, the Huntsville Chapter of EWI offers a unique blend of benefits to member firms and their representatives. It's an opportunity to promote your firm, enhance the professional and personal development of your representative, and give back to the community.

This year our chapter focused on several strategic growth initiatives and I would like to share with you our progress towards each of these.

Improve/Enhance How We Welcome and Orient New Members

Vice President Elect Pam Holtzclaw, Wachovia Securities leads New Member Orientation. Usually an informal luncheon is held in small groups of Chapter Board Members

and new member firm representatives, so that new members can get to know all the ins and outs of our Chapter's workings. A Chapter handbook that has been updated and is distributed to new members at their installation conducted at the monthly meetings.

Work to retain 95% membership of current firms

We added funds to the program budget to allow for flexibility in the types of programs and guest speakers available. Hospitality Chair Paula Cothorn, UAB School of Medicine has worked with the membership committee in developing a networking nook. Members are encouraged to bring business cards and advertising material to place in the nook at each chapter meeting to promote their firm. Programs Director Abigail Rizzardi, of Armstrong Relocation and the programs committee has done an excellent job in preparing programs that reflect members' interest and in encouraging firm nights.

We also expanded our Leadership and Annual Conference Sponsorship program that allows our newest chapter members to experience the life-changing opportunity of attending a Leadership Conference and Annual Meeting in Houston to include a Module of Learning.

Other Strategic Plan Accomplishments

Part of the Chapter's Strategic Plan is to become more visible and recognizable. To do this the Chapter joined the Huntsville Chamber of Commerce and the Chamber became a member of EWI. We utilize the Chamber to network the EWI organization. We also organized and held our first Executive Women of Tomorrow Conference (EWTC). This conference is designed to mentor young women fourteen to eighteen years of age into college and the workforce. This conference also became our main fundraiser for our Scholarship Program and general operating budget, raising \$8,000.00 the first year. Our goal for this year is \$14,000.00. This money goes a long way to also having our scholarship fund being self-sustaining.

In addition to these attendance figures, we had 75 people in attendance at our March Dale Carnegie Training Seminar to boost membership retention and promote new memberships. Of the 75, 43 were employees of member firms and 32 were potential new member firms and their employees.

EWI Member Firms and their Representatives do have attendance requirements. In a calendar year a firm must be represented at seven (7) monthly chapter meetings either by a Representative, Executive or Guest Representative. The firm Representative must be present at six (6) monthly chapter meetings. Should a firm not meet the attendance requirements, they would be considered a firm “not in good stand-ings” and the Membership Committee may elect to post another firm in the same general classification as that firm for membership into the Chapter, which negates the “non-compete” clause in our by laws.

EWISP : The EWI® Scholarship Program (EWISP) is an arm of EWI®'s Business/Career/Development Program (BCDP). The BCDP began in 1974 when Sears, Roebuck and Company invited the corporate office of EWI® to become involved in a community project to encourage the development of careers in business among high school students. For 15 years, the program was co-sponsored and funded by EWI®, Sears, Roebuck and Company, and Lanier Business Products. In 1989 the program became fully funded and administered by EWI® under the exempt status of the Business Career Development Scholarship Program. Today, it is known as the BCDP Program a broad range of educational and philanthropic endeavors and is recognized by **Money** magazine as one of the top 12 scholarship opportunities in the United States.

Applications were mailed to 34 area high schools along with a letter requesting their participation in the EWISP scholarship program. Applications were received from 22 applicants throughout the EWI Service Area.

The three judges for the EWISP Scholarship were **Dr. Lewis Fichter, General Manager, Tecolote Research, Inc; Cyndy Morgan, Junior Achievement, and Mrs. Johnnie Barnes, Owner of Snelling Personnel.**

The three finalists were chosen from Grissom, Section and Douglas High Schools. Our EWISP winner for 2007 is **David Kilgo from Douglas High School.** David will complete his senior year at Douglas in 2008, and his \$2500.00 scholarship will be forwarded to the college of his choice upon acceptance.

David was ranked first in his class of 127 students at Douglas High School in Douglas. He has been consistently awarded for his academic excellence across all subjects during his high school career and is a member of the Varsity Boys' basketball team and was recently named to the 4A Northeast All State Tournament Team. He is a very active member of the FFA and was awarded third place in the Alabama State Livestock Judging Team as a sophomore. His activities extend beyond extracurricular activities at school to service to his community through such organizations as the Alabama Baptist Children's Home, the Ronald McDonald House and his church. David has also represented Douglas High School at the local and state level, serving as a delegate to Boys' State and participating in the Alabama Youth Leadership Program. He has received several leadership awards including the Marshall County Youth Leadership Award and Jacksonville State University's Emerging Youth Leaders Award.

His application was submitted to EWI Corporate Office for the national competition where he may receive up to \$10,000 in scholarship money.

ASIST: The Adult Students in Scholastic Transition (ASIST) is sponsored annually by EWI®, a non-profit international association that has been a champion of education and community involvement since 1938. The ASIST award is a flexible scholarship program that addresses the needs of adults who are working to improve their situation in life through education.

The ASIST program benefits students who, for a variety of reasons, are facing work/life need; socially, physically, and/or economically disadvantaged adults; displaced homemakers; and challenges. The applicants are either single parent, individuals just entering the workforce or displaced workers.

Our 2007 ASIST Winner is **Claudia Sims**, a student at **Snead State Community College** majoring in Associate Degree in Human Resources Management. Claudia is a non-traditional student who returned to school to pursue a degree. She has been had an exceptional academic record at Snead State and is actively involved in various leadership roles on campus. She is a member of Phi Theta Kappa and was nominated for Who's Who among Students in American Junior Colleges for 2006 and 2007. Claudia received an award for Outstanding Student Achievement in Office Administration and has worked with the Financial Aid office in the federal work study program as a financial aid clerk. The \$1500.00 scholarship was sent to Snead for the summer of 2007 to complete her associate degree and move to Athens in the fall of 2007.

Our Annual Scholarship Banquet was held this year at the Huntsville Country Club on May 1, 2007.

Legal Changes for 2007/2008:

Pension Protection Act of 2006 (PPA) does effect how we now are to choose our Scholarship Winners and how we govern our Investments. According to these new guidelines our Scholarship Selection Committee and Investment Committee must be made up of a majority of individuals with NO association with EWI whatsoever. They may not be an employee or owner of a member firm or family member of a representative. It is necessary to have EWI Members on these committees but the MAJORITY must not be associated with EWI in any way. This will be followed for ASIST & EWISP Scholarships and our Investment Committee. Also, we must select the members of these committees prior to the end of August 2007 to be in accordance with the PPA. If you have a contact or two that would be willing to join one of these committees please contact President Lynn Moore with their information.
